


'DEVELOPING FUTURE LEADERS THROUGH EDUCATION'

Forward Momentum.

Welcome to our Annual Report covering July 2024 to June 2025. The year has seen us move from consolidation to expansion, with the selection of new scholars, extending our catchment across Malampa Province, and the happy task of supporting our first wave of young women moving from education into employment.

To ensure that we can fully support our rapidly growing number of scholars we have increased our staffing of the Vila office, and as we publish this report we are delighted that our new Country Manager Leisei Jimmy is joining us to lead the team from early 2026.

Under Jilda Shem's excellent chairing and leadership, our Vanuatu Committee has continued to develop its oversight and support role, providing direction to the program and initiating an active fundraising strategy to generate more financial and other support from Vanuatu sources.

We have been fortunate to retain funding support from friends and existing supporters, and also increase our recurring donations. The major part of our expenditure is focused on scholarships, and increasing Vanuatu-centred costs in terms of staff and operational overheads.

We continue to be enormously grateful for the continuing support and commitment from all our staff, supporters and Board members





Our Scholars

Five of our Scholars took up university and further education places, and three moved into the world of work

As we move into our seventh year of operation, we're delighted to report that many of our early recruits are now well into their tertiary studies and are starting to build their future in the world of work

Jassinda was one of the first girls selected into our scholarship program back in 2019. Aged 16 in year 10 at Rensarie College on Malekula, she presented as quietly determined to succeed as an accountant, despite her family struggling to pay her school fees.

Today, Jassinda can be found wearing the WFF logo Polo shirt behind the administration desk in our Port Vila office.

While studying part time to complete her third year of a Commerce Accounting degree at the University of the South Pacific, Jassinda has taken on the Administrator and Finance Officer role for us. She is proving to be a very efficient and valued member of our small team and is a wonderful support to young students joining the program.

Through a Vanuatu government scholarship and part-time work to support herself she is independently pursuing her dream.







Our Scholars







Angela Titus is from Malo island and a former British Friends of Vanuatu scholar, who joined our Foundation for the years when she completed her tertiary studies with USP.

Angela is passionate about sustainable agriculture, food security and self-sufficiency, and during her study years she and family members established an extensive and highly successful fruit and vegetable farm on Malo. In addition to local sales, Angela runs a regular stall at Santo town market where her quality produce is in strong demand.

More recently Angela has commenced work on a second farm, renting several hectares of land close to Santo town, which will enable her to develop and expand her pig-rearing and poultry businesses. The Foundation is continually in awe of what she has achieved, and the energy and commitment she has to building a lasting enterprise for her family and community.

Angela is a true entrepreneur and we're confident that she will take on a leadership role in Vanuatu's farming sector in the years to come. She truly exemplifies our commitment to 'building future leaders through education'.



Highlights

We rolled out our mentoring and additional support program to all of our students

Under Kathy Solomon's experienced leadership we took our mentoring support program to the next level, ensuring that each scholar received wellbeing counselling, career advice and access to additional tuition where needed

In Vila, we engaged Maths and English tutors to provide valuable weekly tuition to our students in years 11 to 14, both Anglophone and Francophone.

We also initiated additional maths tuition for our Malekula students at Lakatoro school. In a year of continuing teacher strikes in Vanuatu, the tuition has proved invaluable.

Kathy also worked to recruit and train voluntary mentors amongst mature professional women in Vila, Santo and Malekula, culminating in a very successful mentoring workshop run by her and Sallie in Vila, attended by 23 Mentors and 15 students.

Their efforts have created a group of experienced and trained mentors who will be on-hand to support our scholars in the years to come.





Highlights

We selected 10 new scholars into the program, taking our total to 28

After a year of consolidation, we took the decision to move forward and expand and extend our program to offer opportunities to all eligible girls in schools across Malampa Province. This led to the successful selection of 10 new scholars from additional schools on Malekula, and our first Paama-based scholar

Our open selection process generated a good response from schools across the Province. The shortlisting and interviewing was handled by a panel consisting of Vanuatu Committee member Sherol George, Merion Hophand from Malampa Education Department and Letty Kaltonga from our Vila office. Ten new scholars were selected most of whom have begun their Year 11 studies at Lakatoro School. We were delighted to welcome Sanalyn Tasso, our first scholar from Paama, hopefully the first of many.





As we publish this report, selection for our 2026 intake is under way, with a record number of applicants received from Malampa schools
